

LEGEND: "E" indicates a spacer for a 1/2-inch thick disc; "G" indicates EPR seals for use with automotive brake fluid; and "V" indicates VITON® and Teflon® seals for use with non-flammable phosphate-ester hydraulic fluids.

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INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

- Install brake so that flat face is flush against its mount. Use 3/4 x 5inch Grade 8 bolts.
- Disc should be centered in such a manner to allow .030 inch clearance between the puck and disc, per side, when new.
- 3. Attach hydraulic pressure line to port (#10 or #11) and bleed the brake to remove any trapped air.
- 4. Maximum pressure 1500 PSI (103 Bars).

DISASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Remove the 3/4 x 5-inch mounting bolts and dismount the brake.
- 2. Disconnect the hydraulic pressure line.
- 3. Remove Snap Rings (#5).
- 4. Gently push End Cap (#2) and Piston Assembly (#3) out, taking care not to damage O-Ring (#8) and Back-Up Ring (#9).
- Remove four Screws (#6) from the Pucks (#4) and inspect the Pucks for cracks and excessive wear. Replace as required.
- 6. Remove O-Rings (#8) and Back-Up Rings (#9) from End Caps (#2) and Pistons (#2). Replace with new O-rings and Back-Up Rings, lubricating with a good O-Ring grease such as Lubriplate® #105. O-Rings and Back-Up Rings should be arranged such that the O-Ring faces the hydraulic pressure with the Back-Up Ring behind it.
- Install new Pucks (#4), using Screws (#6). Coat Screws with Loctite[®] #242.
- 8. Lubricate bore of the brake housing (#1) with Lubriplate® #105.
- 9. Install assembled pistons gently from the outside.
- Reinstall End Caps (#2) with shoulder to the outside of the brake housing.
- 11. Reinstall the Snap Rings (#5) on End Caps, using a snap-ring pliers.
- 12. Follow Installation Instructions to remount the brake.

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
